Note: Sports that have both male and female competitors must ensure that at least one coach/manager is of the opposite gender of the other(s)

3.0 CLASSIFICATIONS:

- 3.1 Year of Birth: U19 – Born 1999 or later

4.0 ELIGIBILITY:

- 4.1 Athletes: Member in good standing with Saskatchewan Badminton Association
- 4.2 Coaches: Old level 1 or Competitive Regional
Coaches and managers must have a Criminal and Vulnerable Sector Record check. Coaches must complete the Respect in Sport on-line training program.

7.0 COMPETITION:

7.1 Type of Competition

Competition will consist of a round robin competition with Nine (9) matches per tie.

7.2 Events: 2 Men's Singles, 2 Ladies Singles, 2 Men's Doubles, 2 Ladies Doubles and 1 Mixed Doubles

Nominations for teams for each tie: The coach of each District must nominate the position of players in writing to the referee at least 30 minutes before the start of each encounter. Following the first encounter, any changes in positions at the discretion of the coach must be submitted in writing to the referee at least 30 minutes before the start of each succeeding encounter.

Players may only be nominated for a maximum of two events per encounter. No player can be nominated for more than one position in the same discipline. Once the referee has received the names of the players nominated to play in an encounter, no changes or substitutions may be made for that encounter. **Example:**

District 1 players: A, B, C, D, E

Singles A	Doubles A and B	Mixed Doubles C or D plus E
Singles B	Doubles C and D	

All Districts must declare two separate ranking orders for Male and for Female (#1 - #5), one for Singles and the other for Doubles. The ranking order should be based on the latest Provincial rankings.

While submitting your roster for each tie: Singles: The player with the highest singles ranking on your team's roster will play at position # 1 and the other player will play at #2. Doubles: Doubles team that includes the player with the highest doubles ranking on the team roster will play at position #1 and the other team will play at #2.

Each team member must play in at least one discipline per tie in the round robin portion of the schedule. Team roster for the seeding and finals will be at the discretion of the coach, (players can only play in 2 disciplines in the final tie).

7.3 Playoff Format: 1st of Pool A vs 1st of Pool B Gold and Silver Match
2nd of Pool A vs 2nd of Pool B Bronze and 4th Match
3rd of Pool A vs 3rd of Pool B 5th and 6th Match
4th of Pool A vs 4th of Pool B 7th and 8th Match

7.4 Seeding: The Districts will participate in a round robin play in two pools. Pool A will be (1,4,5,8,9) and Pool B will be (2,3,6,7). Pools will be determined by the last games standings.

8.0 RESULTS:

8.0 Results Program:

8.1 Results Format: Best of 9 disciplines to win the tie

8.2 Sport Scoring: 3 games to 21 points, in case of a tie after 21 you must win by 2 points until you reach 30, then the first one to reach 30 wins

8.3 TIE BREAKING PROCEDURE:

Two Districts tied – The district that won the match between the two districts involved in the tie. Three Districts tied – the district with the fewest points scored against them in the matches played between the districts involved will be the winner.

8.4 SPORT PROTEST PROCEDURE:

The only protests which can be taken to the sport jury will be in accordance with the rules and regulations of Badminton Canada. Officials' calls will not be allowed for a protest.

9.0 EQUIPMENT: 6 Badminton courts, poles, nets and Mavis 350 yellow shuttles.

10.0 SPORT JURY:

SBA technical director, head referee, Sask Sport representative and host official.

11.0 OFFICIALS REQUIRED:

- 13.1 Major Officials: National caliber official
- 13.2 Minor Officials: 6 certified umpires

14.0 MEDICAL SERVICES: Medical services should be able to tape an athlete
