2.0 PARTICIPANTS:

- 2.1 Number of Competitors per District: Male 4 Female 4
- 2.2 Coaches and Managers per District: Coach 1 Manager 1
Note: Sports that have both male and female competitors must ensure that at least one coach/manager is of the opposite gender of the other(s)

3.0 CLASSIFICATIONS:

- 3.1 Year of Birth: All athletes must be born between January 1, 2000 and December 31, 2006

4.0 ELIGIBILITY:

- 4.1 Athletes must be members in good standing of the Saskatchewan Target Shooting Association. Athletes who have been named to the National Junior or Development team (past or present) are not eligible to attend.
- 4.2
 - 1) Coaches must be certified in NCCP Instructor Beginner (or previous equivalent) in Pistol or Rifle
 - 2) Coaches, Managers and Officials require a current Criminal and Vulnerable Record Check (within 6 months of the start of the Games) and must complete the Respect in Sport on-line training program prior to the Games.

7.1 Type of Competition 10 Meter ISSF Air Rifle
10 Meter ISSF Air Pistol

7.2 Events

Mixed Team Rifle – each district will make two teams of one male and one female per team who will shoot 40 shots each, totaling a score out of 80 shots
Mixed Team Pistol - each district will make two teams of one male and one female per team who will shoot 40 shots each, totaling a score out of 80 shots
Individual Rifle – Qualification round 60 shots for men and 40 shots for women, followed by Finals
Individual Pistol – Qualification round 60 shots for men and 40 shots for women, followed by Finals
Men’s Super Finals Rifle – double knock out
Women’s Super Finals Rifle -- double knock out
Men’s Super Finals Pistol- double knock out
Women’s Super Finals Pistol –double knock out

11.0 EQUIPMENT:

11.1 Athletes

- 1) .177 single shot Air Rifle or Air Pistol conforming to ISSF rules; however, rifles are limited to Hammerli AR20/CZ 200T or similar quality/value. If in doubt of eligibility of a rifle, consult the STSA Provincial Technical Liaison.
- 2) Eye and hearing protection conforming to ISSF rules.
- 3) Competition clothing/footwear conforming to ISSF rules, with appropriate District colours. for shirts. Rifle athletes can wear canvas rifle jacket and pants which are not required to be in District colors provided they meet ISSF rules, but must wear their District colours when at the range and not competing.

11.2 Host City Facility (as per standards/requirements document)

- 1) Minimum 15 meter by 25 meter competition area, complete with 20 shooting positions
- 2) Target range must be well lit
- 3) Team waiting area/room(s) including area for filling air/CO cylinders for air guns
- 4) Storage area for air rifles, air pistols and related equipment
- 5) Electronic Target administration area with easy viewing of the air gun range, to be cordoned off to athletes and coaches
- 6) Large screen used to display athletes scores during the event – allows coaches and spectators to view immediate results
- 7) Spectator seating/bleachers located behind competition area.
