**1.0 SPORT: GOLF**

- 1.1 Competition Site: Lloydminster Golf and Curling Centre
- 1.2 Competition Dates: July 26-29, 2020
- 1.3 Sanction: Yes

**2.0 PARTICIPANTS:**

- 2.1 Number of Competitors per district: Males 3 Females 3
- 2.2 Coaches and Managers: 1 Coach 1 Manager:  
Please note: Sports that have both male and female competitors must ensure that at least one coach/manager is of the opposite gender of the other(s).

**3.0 CLASSIFICATIONS:**

- 3.1 Year of Birth: 3 male and 3 female competitors 17 years and under as of the final day of the 2020 Golf Canada Junior Women's & Junior Men's Championships (July 31, 2020). Each of the players competing in the Saskatchewan Summer Games will be eligible to qualify for the 2021 Canada Games.

**4.0 ELIGIBILITY:**

- 4.1 Athletes:
  - 4.1.1 All competitors must be members of Golf Saskatchewan and hold a membership at a member club or public player club.
  - 4.1.2 Each team shall consist of 3 male and 3 female competitors.
  - 4.1.3 Each District Team will be decided through either:
    - 4.1.3.1 The current Golf Saskatchewan Junior Order of Merit Tour Standings can be used, although,
    - 4.1.3.2 A play down in each zone/region/district is preferred.

- 4.1.4 In the event a District does not have a participant, Golf Saskatchewan reserves the right to invite or name an eligible player to compete in the championship.
- 4.2 Coaches:
- 4.2.1 The Coaching Certification Program is still in the works between Golf Canada and the PGA of Canada. A top level coach (CNC/CDC) is not required for these games

As a coach or manager of a district team you will be volunteering with children, who are vulnerable members of our society. As per the policy of the Saskatchewan Games Council all coaches and managers are required to undergo a Criminal Record Check and a Vulnerable Sector Check.

As per the mandatory requirements for all sports in Saskatchewan the "Respect In Sport" online training program must be taken by all coaches. It is strongly recommended that managers take the online training to ensure that as youth leaders they recognize, understand and respond to issues of abuse, bullying and harassment.

- 4.3 Exclusions:
- 4.3.1 None at this time.
- 4.3.2 The point may be revisited prior to the competition.

## **7.0 COMPETITION:**

- 7.1 Type of Competition
- Individual and Team
  - The Stableford scoring system will be used. Rather than counting the total number of strokes taken, as in [stroke play](#), it involves scoring points based on the number of strokes taken at each hole. Unlike traditional scoring methods,

where the goal is to accumulate the lowest number of strokes, under Stableford rules, the objective is to have the highest point total.

The Stableford scoring system was developed to deter golfers from giving up on their round after just one or two bad holes. The number of points awarded on each hole is determined based on comparison of the number of strokes taken to a fixed score, usually [par](#). Once a player has taken two strokes more than the adjusted fixed score, they may pick up their ball as it is then not possible to score any points on that hole. They can then resume play on the next hole. Because of this, it is still possible to be competitive even allowing for a few bad holes. At the end of the round, the number of points scored on each hole is totaled to give a final score. The winner of a Stableford competition is the player with the highest point total.

- **Individual Scoring:**

Points	Strokes taken in relation to par
10 points	<a href="#">Albatross</a> (3 strokes under par)
7 points	<a href="#">Eagle</a> (2 strokes under par)
5 points	<a href="#">Birdie</a> (1 stroke under par)
3 points	<a href="#">Par</a>
2 point	<a href="#">Bogey</a> (1 stroke over par)
1 points	<a href="#">Double bogey</a> or worse (2 strokes or more over par)

(**Team Scoring:** Will count the top 2 point totals for each team on each hole and will then calculate the highest overall point total for each round).

**8.0 RESULTS:**

- 8.1 Results Program Team Competition – the team score is made up of the 2 best of 3 scores per hole to make up the total team score over 36 holes.
- 8.2 Individual Competition – total 36 Stableford point total scores
- 8.3 Individual and Team Competitions to run concurrent

**9.0 TIE BREAKING PROCEDURE:**

- 9.1 Individuals:

- If two or more individuals are tied following 36 holes and the overall point totals, a hole by hole sudden victory play-off will take place beginning on the first tee and continue in the normal sequence of holes.
- The order of play at the first tee of the play-off will be determined by lot, the players involved in the play-off being asked to pick a numbered piece of paper. The first player to post the score will be asked to select first and will go in the order indicated on the paper. The player picking #1 must play first, #2 second, and so on.

#### 9.2 Teams:

- Two Team Play-off: Two of three scores to count. Competitors are divided into four groups; one player from each zone in each group. The order of play at the first tee of the play-off will be determined by lot, the teams involved in the play-off being asked to pick a numbered piece of paper. The first team to post the score will be asked to select first and will go in the order indicated on the paper. The team picking #1 must play first, #2 second, and so on. Pairing of the second, third and fourth groups will be the same order as the first pairing. Pairing of groups will be the responsibility of Golf Saskatchewan. After completion of the first play-off hole, the first group shall wait for the second, third and fourth groups to complete play of the hole. If teams are still tied, they will continue using the same format.
- Three Team Play-off: Two of three scores to count. Competitors are divided into four groups; one player from each zone in each group. The order of play at the first tee of the play-off will be determined by lot, the teams involved in the play-off being asked to pick a numbered piece of paper. The first team to post the score will be asked to select first and will go in the order indicated on the paper. The team picking #1 must play first, #2 second, and so on. Pairing of the second, third and fourth groups will be the same order as the first pairing. Pairing of groups will be the responsibility of Golf Saskatchewan. After completion of the first play-off hole, the first group shall wait for the second, third and fourth groups to complete play of the hole. If teams are still tied, they will continue using the same format. If one team is eliminated, the format will revert to the two team play-off format.
- If there are four team playoffs it will be similar to the format listed above.

### 10.0 SPORT PROTEST PROCEDURE:

- 10.1 All non-golf related protests will be handled by the Saskatchewan Summer Games and Golf Saskatchewan Tournament Committee (or designate).
- 10.2 All matters related to on course rules are handled by the Golf Saskatchewan Rules Committee as per the Golf Canada Rules of Golf 2016-2020. The decision reached by the Rules Committee is final.

### 11.0 EQUIPMENT:

- 11.1 Each player is responsible for providing his/her own equipment in accordance to the Rules of Golf
- 11.2 The use of power carts is not allowed by participants unless authorized by the Rules/Tournament Committee.
- 11.3 Parents & Spectators are allowed on course as per the Golf Saskatchewan Parent & Spectator's regulations

**12.0 SPORT JURY:**

- 12.1 In accordance with the Golf Canada Rules of Golf

  - 13.1.1 Two (2) Provincially Accredited Level 3 Rules Officials

  - 13.2.1 2 Starters
  - 13.2.2 2 Scoring Assistances
  - 13.2.3 Spotters (Forecaddies) as required
