Jumpstart Accessibility Grants

Jumpstart Accessibility Grants are intended to support capital costs of construction and renovations related to improving physical accessibility to, and inclusivity in, recreation facilities for children with disabilities in Canadian communities. The grant offers two funding streams: *Accessibility-Enabling Grants*, which provide eligible facilities with up to \$50,000 for projects to adapt and enhance existing facilities, and *Inclusive Design Innovation Grants*, which provide between \$250,000 and \$1,000,000 for projects designed to uniquely enhance sport and recreation spaces with innovative solutions.

The purpose of the *Celebration Initiative Grant for June is Recreation & Parks Month* (JRPM) is to ensure that June will be recognized as Recreation and Parks Month and to support localized promotion through planned events or programs. SPRA will contribute up to a maximum of \$500 per JRPM Ambassador (supporting communities and agencies) that are active members of SPRA.
