- · Preparing schedules and reports for the program area
- · Encouraging camper participation
- · Actively participating with campers in program areas
- May be required to provide personal care to campers ages 6 to over 65

- · Documenting and reporting relevant information regarding the camper's health and safety; includes camper reports
- · Other duties as specified by the Camp Manager or designate
