Creative Saskatchewan sponsorships are available year-round until the fund is exhausted, or until the cut off date of January 31, 2023. The maximum sponsorship request is \$5,000 per organization per calendar year.

Dakota Dunes Community Development Grant

Funding for community investment grants is allowable under the following categories: Economic development; Social development; Justice initiatives; Education development; Recreational facilities operation and development; Senior and youth programs; Cultural development; Community infrastructure development and maintenance; Health initiatives; and, Other charitable purposes.

Dreamcatcher Charitable Foundation: Dreamcatcher Fund

A registered foundation designated to provide support and address situations unique to the First Nations community. The Foundation will supply grants to individuals with a goal of developing youth as future community leaders.

Enerplus

Enerplus encourages interested community organizations in their areas of operation to apply for funding. Applicants do not have to be a registered charity.

Library and Archives Canada (LAC) provides \$1.5 million in contributions each year through DHCP funding to projects and organizations that ensure Canada's continuing memory is documented and accessible to current and future generations. Eligibility is open to non-profit organizations that hold collections of mainly local or regional significance.

[Government of Canada: Enabling Accessibility Fund](#)

The Enabling Accessibility Fund (EAF) provides funding for eligible capital projects that increase accessibility for people with disabilities in Canadian communities and workplaces, creating more opportunities for people with disabilities to participate in community activities, programs and services, or access employment opportunities.

The Events component of the Community Support, Multiculturalism, and Anti-Racism Initiatives Program provides funding to community-based events that promote intercultural or interfaith understanding, promote discussions on multiculturalism, diversity, racism and religious discrimination, or celebrate a community's history and culture such as heritage months recognized by Parliament.

This five-year \$1.5 billion program will support green and accessible retrofits, repairs or upgrades of existing public community buildings and the construction of new publicly-accessible community buildings that serve high-needs, underserved communities across Canada.

Eligible organizations can apply for up to \$25,000 for projects that are led by seniors and volunteer based. You can only apply to the program for 1 grant, either for a small grant up to \$5,000, or a regular grant up to \$25,000.

[Government of Canada: Young Canada Works](#)

Young Canada Works (YCW) offers eligible employers wage subsidies and access to a pool of talented youth with innovative ideas and competitive skills.

[Government of Canada: Youth Take Charge](#)

Through partnerships with youth-serving organizations, the Youth Take Charge Program supports projects that exemplify an ability to strengthen youth attachment to Canada in the following thematic areas: History and heritage, Civic engagement and youth service, Arts and culture, Economic activities.

[Government of Saskatchewan: Canada-Saskatchewan Job Grant](#)

The Canada-Saskatchewan Job Grant is an employer-driven program that: 1) helps businesses and non-profit organizations train new or existing employees for available jobs; and 2) provides more opportunities for unemployed and underemployed workers to receive training. Through the program, the employer contributes one-third of the training cost, while the federal and provincial governments contribute the remaining two-thirds.

[Government of Saskatchewan: Facilitating Independence of Older Adults in the Community](#)

Facilitating Independence of Older Adults in the Community granting program encourages the development and testing of new ways of supporting seniors to maintain independence in their own homes, with the goal of using these approaches in other communities throughout the province. The program is led by the Saskatchewan Seniors Mechanism (SSM) in partnership with the Ministry of Health. Funding will support at least 10 community projects, each receiving up to \$20,000.

[Government of Saskatchewan: Transit Assistance for People with Disabilities](#)

The Government of Saskatchewan's role under the Transit Assistance for People with Disabilities (TAPD) program is to provide financial support to municipalities who offer para-transit services for persons with disabilities.

[Government of Saskatchewan: Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program](#)

The governments of Canada and Saskatchewan signed a bilateral agreement in October 2018 for the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP). The program will provide more than \$896 million in federal funding for all types of Saskatchewan infrastructure projects over 10 years until 2028.
