The most sacrosanct and central element in Remembrance is the Two Minutes of Silence.

At the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, the month, day and time in 1918 when the First World War ceased hostilities, Canadians pause to observe two minutes of silence to honour the Fallen, and recognize the sacrifices or servicemen and women.

The Two Minutes of Silence is a poignant moment in the Remembrance Day Service that incorporates symbolic association in a brief, non-religious ceremony.

Community Rink Affordability Grant Opens

Skating and curling rinks are integral to the creation of vibrant, active, and connected communities in Saskatchewan. Recognizing the escalating operating costs communities and organizations face, SPRA has once again partnered with the Government of Saskatchewan to offer the Community Rink Affordability Grant.

In 2022-23, a total of the 581 ice surfaces received funding, including 376 skating rinks and 205 curling rinks. A \$2,500 grant is available for each ice surface, per year, for municipally owned facilities, schools, Indigenous communities and non-profit organizations.

Judo is running at Connaught with 24 students enrolled for the year. The program has changed a bit and now runs twice a week from September to May.


